



150 Years in Pittsburgh!

As we have mentioned in previous newsletters, 2022 is our sesquicentennial anniversary—150 years of serving the elderly poor of Pittsburgh! This milestone has only been made possible through Divine Providence and the strong support of the Pittsburgh community.

When seven Little Sisters first arrived in Pittsburgh in 1872, they had nothing. In fact, two of those young sisters would die within the first few months of arriving from typhoid because of their first home's proximity to the Allegheny river.

Over time our Pittsburgh foundation grew from a small house in Allegheny City "North Side" to two large homes on Penn Avenue and present-day Benton Avenue. While the Residents, Sisters, staff, and buildings have changed over the years, the guiding light of this work has never faltered. The mission remains the same today as it did 150 years ago—to serve the neediest elderly of every race and religion a

home where they will be welcomed as Christ, cared for as family and accompanied with dignity until God calls them to Himself.

Since arriving, we have welcomed more than 12,000 Pittsburghers regardless of race or religion. The legacy of our Mother foundress, St. Jeanne Jugan, continues as elderly

To mark this anniversary, Bishop David Zubik celebrated an "in-house" Mass on April 25th, the actual anniversary date of the first seven Little Sisters arriving from overseas. Residents, Sisters, staff and volunteers attended the Mass which

Following the April 25th Mass, Bishop Zubik accompanied the Little Sisters, including three postulants from Baltimore, to the newly renovated third floor of the Jeanne Jugan Pavilion to bless this space. The Bishop proceeded to bless the six new rooms including the crucifixes and icons.

As many Little Sisters continue to age, there is a greater need to plan for the future. With this in mind the Pittsburgh home recently completed renovations to a space adjacent to the current convent. This private hallway is physically connected to the footprint of the home, but will offer the aging Sisters a space of their own separate from the nursing home and independent living apartments. The space is completely furnished with new hospital beds and lift chairs. There is a dedicated bathing room, community space and a large dining area.

Soon the Pittsburgh home will welcome up to six Little Sisters in need of long term or temporary nursing care. Their prayers and presence will be a blessing for all who live, work or volunteer here. Thank you to all the partners who assisted us with this special project!
