In early October Sister Augustine of St. Chantal passed away following a long illness. Sister had lived at the Pittsburgh Home since 2016. She had many roles here including the Jeanne Jugan Association facilitator. In this role she worked with lay people to support the Sisters efforts and their mission.

Over the years, Sister made many connections with the people of Pittsburgh. Whether it was calling donors to thank them for donations or being a witness of her faith in the community, Sister impacted many lives. One unique relationship began when Sister was at a local hospital for an appointment. A man approached her asking for prayers for his young son, who was born prematurely in that same hospital. He was in the NICU and the family needed prayers. Sister graciously offered to pray, but asked the son's name to make her prayers more personal. To her delight the father told her that the baby's name was August. Sister Augustine's face lit up as she pointed to her own name label on her walker. From then on Gus's family and Sister stayed connected and united in prayer. August "Gus" even came to visit with his parents Cary and Amy last December.

Sister will be missed by all here in Pittsburgh and her two surviving brothers, Brian and John, along with nieces and nephews.

Vocation Fair

On October 13th, 2023 Sister Georgia, Sister Jessica (from the Philadelphia home) and Mother Loraine Marie Clare, participated in the Religious Vocations Fair at Franciscan University of Steubenville, Ohio. Sixty-five religious communities of men and women filled the large gymnasium on campus. Father David Pivonka started the fair in the morning with a blessing. A continuous stream of young people came by the booths all morning. The noon Mass celebrated in the Christ the King Chapel was overflowing.

After lunch the Sisters were again stationed at their table distributing literature about the Little Sisters' mission. Many of the students they met were majoring in theology and nursing. The students were drawn by the large displays of sisters with Residents and expressed particular interest in our apostolate with the elderly. Others were happy to learn about our charism and asked questions such as "what is your

favorite part of being a consecrated religious?" and "how did you know you were called to your order?" Multiple young women expressed an interest in our Congregation's *Spring into Service* opportunity offered at our Homes every year.

We were grateful for this opportunity to interact with young people whose faith and fervor are so encouraging, and for the chance to share with them more about St. Jeanne Jugan and the Little Sisters.
